President's Letter:


VOLUNTEERING: IT MAKES NO CENTS, BUT THE REWARDS ARE AMAZING!

The raffle quilt will be in the process of being hand quilted when this newsletter comes out. Raffle tickets will be available at the April 29th quilt meeting. 



Guild Meeting Business



Prompt payment of your dues is required and appreciated. Please help us out by renewing your dues promptly.







NEEDED - Have any kitchen towels that you are not using, the quilt show cafe could use them!


